This floor lamp is made of black-painted aluminum, with a black or white rotating diffuser, and finished with a red apple, a reference to the fruit that fell on Newton's head and led him to speculate about gravity. An important figure in American mid-century design, Paul McCobb designed this chair and ottoman in 1956. His style was influenced by the Shaker and Scandinavian designs that are pillars of Madeline de Pauw's aesthetic, so it's appropriate that in 2019 it became part of the De Pauw collection. **GLI SCACCHI**  
by Mario Bini  
1971

Like the Re and Regina lamps, these side tables are based on chess pieces. The Italian architect Mario Bini designed them in 1971; they were released last year. The queen, knight and rook can be bought separately or as a set, as shown here.
